Pool Operations and Maintenance, Dennis Egan Chair:

Summer is fast approaching and the pool will be open from Memorial Day weekend thru Labor Day weekend. Because of Covid we are limited to 30 in the pool but we can have up to 120 on the pool deck so better than last year. Still have many Covid requirements to comply with but it will be doable. Shore Armoring: Ed Delahanty Chair

The Shore Armoring Committee is an ad hoc committee formed by the Board last year to investigate options and related cost for protecting the pool and other ACBC facilities from future storm damage with some form of shore armoring. After reviewing a Geocoastal Report that assessed the extent of potential storm damage, the committee developed a draft Request for Proposal (RFP) to send to at least 3 qualified consultants for the purpose of obtaining initial estimates for the project so a preliminary budget can be developed. The Board reviewed the RFP at the May Board meeting and the RFP will be sent out to the consultants by the end of the month.

Lake Committee: Bob Wilbur & Bill Blakly Co-Chairs

Since we last spoke, the Lake Committee and a few community members met with reps from Island County to determine what recreational activities in Admirals Lake are compatible with County. Per the Shoreline Master Program the lake will be classified "aquatic," which under critical areas designation will be an "estuarine wetland." As such, no motorized craft are allowed to operate on the lake. That is consistent with ACBC's historical position disallowing motorized use of the lake, so it shouldn't be transitional or too impactful.

In keeping with that, the Lake Committee is anticipating action on its lake management plan, which the committee submitted to the BOD several months ago. The Board had held off acting on that plan until getting further information on the recreational uses permitted by the County.

FYI for some, our meeting with the County also revealed that the homes on the south side of Keystone Ave that front the Puget Sound will be classified as a Historic Beach Community. Most all homes on the north side of Keystone Ave that front Admirals Lake will not be considered designated as Shoreline Residential, mostly because they setback more than 30 ft from the lake's ordinary high water mark. The ACBC property is classified as Rural Conservancy, which apparently gives ACBC more options than it may have had otherwise.

We also welcome to the Lake Committee new lakeshore resident and neighbor Dave Dossett, who heralds from Ketchikan, Alaska, where he was a school administrator for many years.

Meanwhile, back on the lake, there seems to be a lot of reproductive activity ongoing with the drakes in full nuptial plumage watching over the nesting hens...not to ignore the killdeers that have already hatched golfballs of fluff with gangly running legs. Yes, the swallows are here too, are in the middle of making tidy little mud nests in unwanted places. And the bats are also back to take over the bugcontrol night shift when the swallows head home to roost. That's it from the Nature Corner, thanks for tuning in...
