BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

POOL COMMITTEE:

Only when we reach Phase 3 can we open with TBD limitations and requirements. It is our plan to open the pool as soon as it is allowed and we make any of the changes that may be required. GROUNDS AND BUILDING COMMITTEE:

BYLAWS COMMITTEE:

The Bylaws Committee is charged with evaluating suggested changes to the ACBC Bylaws and making recommendations to the Board regarding same. The final decision as to whether to submit a bylaws change to the members for a vote is always up to the Board, unless the process spelled out in the bylaws for submitting a change directly to the members is correctly followed. The Bylaws Committee welcomes suggestions for bylaws changes from members in good standing. Any such suggestions can be emailed to the committee chairperson atkblankenship@bluewilliams.com. The committee will then discuss and evaluate suggested changes and vote on whether to recommend them to the Board. The Bylaws Committee anticipates beginning its meetings in August. All members are welcome to attend such meetings, but only members of the Committee are entitled to vote on recommending any suggested changes to the Board.

LAKE COMMITTEE:

Two Committee members investigated the feasibility of clearing the creek/ditch starting at the NW end of Admirals Lake that drained to Crockett Lake - as recently as 2008 - to allow the lake an additional drainage path independent of the tide gate. Access to the ditch at a point around 700 yds and 1,000 yds upstream from the creek mouth proved difficult, indicating that any attempt to clear the ditch for drainage to Crockett Lake would be difficult, costly and likely not allowed by Whidbey Camano Land Trust, who own the property.

A brief evaluation of the feasibility of digging a new drainage ditch from near the mouth of the creek across the adjacent wetland to connect with an existing drainage ditch running to Crockett Lake appears technically feasible. This will be further investigated in the next few months. No action will be taken to treat the Lake with NT Max this year in an attempt to contain or eliminate algae growth. Experts from State Ecology and other sources felt it would have little or no impact on algae growth. Info to be gathered on nanobubble technology which seems to promise the most effective oxygenation of lake water to improve overall water ecology. Estimates for a nanobubble system will be provided for inclusion in 2021 budget. Growth of what appears to be widgeon grass developing this spring. Will ask for positive identification. A Lake Committee meeting will be held sometime in June on the same Zoom address above.
