BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Hope all are doing well. It is a challenging time. The BOD meetings are held online via zoom on the third Tuesday of the month at 6:30 pm. It has been a busy summer: tree trimming along lower Byrd, ditch cleaning, basketball hoop replacement, clearing out outflow pipe area, mowing, and much more. have worked hard keeping the maintenance cost down.

So far this year we are running slightly under budget for most categories. Collections of past due accounts are going well and the funds collected have been added to the Reserve Account. We now have over \$330,000 in the Reserve Account. This is about half of what is needed to fund the account; there are major expenses coming up in the next 5 years. Dennis Egan. COMMITTEES:

BUDGET AND FINANCE:

The Budget committee will be asking our various committees to submit their budget requests for 2021 in the next month or so.

POOL COMMITTEE:

It has been a challenge this year. We were able to open the pool once Island County went to Phase III. There were several changes to the requirements over the swim season but we were able to comply with the requirements. We were checked by Island County Health Dept and showed them the policy changes we made to address Covid-19 and Safe Start requirements and

they allowed us to open this year. However, we were not able to safely address the requirements for swim lessons this year (social distancing with young swimmers) but look forward to having them next year.

Staffing lifeguards was a challenge this year. Most of the lifeguards from last year returned but all went off to college before the end of our swim season. To our benefit, the Oak Harbor city pool closed mid-season and we were able to hire several of their lifeguards and it looks like they want to work at our pool again, next year. Because of Covid-19, there were no classes to certify new lifeguards in the area.

TELLERS COMMITTEE: The ballot may be lengthy this year due to several prospective by-laws changes, assessments and two new director positions. Additional membership help will be needed with the tally. This committee needs a new chairperson. Thank you, Steve for serving.

SOCIAL COMMITTEE:

2020 has been a most unusual year. Following our governor's regulations we were not able to have our barbecues/potlucks, garage sale, morning coffee, etc. Let's hope that 2021 is a better year and that we can continue our activities like we did last summer. GROUNDS AND BUILDING COMMITTEE:

The president has mentioned most of the activities that took place. I'd like to thank the volunteers who help make this happen. The new basketball posts were given three coats of primer and paint. The old posts were removed by the contractor who cleaned the ditch and cleared the area in front of the tide gate. The basketball area was pressure washed, lines then painted. Tree service: they trimmed trees back from the playground area, basketball area, and both sides of the roadway.

We removed two "driftwood forts" from the beach, as they are a hazard. We're noticing an increase in litter and trash, including needles and syringes. One of the outside restrooms was vandalized, no suspects. Our storage shed was broken into, lock was cut off. The only item we found missing was a Ryobi weed trimmer, with a limb trimming attachment. Again, no suspects. Future work: The Shelter roof requires repair. Speed bumps and fog lines need to be painted on the roadway. Septic drain field needs to be cleared of scotch broom.

AD HOC COMMITTEE: Beach Soft Armoring Committee

To protect the Pool Facility and the Shelter, an ad-hoc committee to investigate the feasibility and expense of soft armoring for the beachfront property owned by the Club has been authorized by the Board of Directors. LAKE COMMITTEE:

The Lake Committee recently conducted a community online survey to help understand the community's interest in the lake, which it turns out, is strongly related to its wildlife values and getting a handle on the ugly summer algal blooms. SUMMARY OF ADMIRALS LAKE ONLINE SURVEY, 2020

For the residents who completed the 2020 Lake Committee Survey, thank you for your time and cooperation. The Admirals Lake Committee works diligently to serve the interests of the community. However, that does require residents to voice their interests and concerns regarding the lake. Below are the Committee's top 3 priorities as informed by the resident responses on the 2020 Admirals Lake Online Survey. Note: "Agreement" percentages were collapsed across both "Strongly Agree" and "Agree" responses (N = 46 respondents).

1.) Admirals Lake Water Quality Management

Informed by the question, "I encourage ACBC to manage the water quality of Admirals Lake by reducing phosphorous that causes toxic blue-green algae blooms."

• 77% Agreement Among All Respondents

2.) Lake Management Must be Sustainable and Non-Toxic

Informed by the question, "Treatment for the algae should be environmentally sustainable and not negatively impact wildlife."

• 89% Agreement Among All Respondents

3.) Admirals Lake Wildlife Protection and Stewardship

Informed by the questions,

"I appreciate the wildlife (e.g., birds and animals) that use the lake for breeding, feeding, resting, and nesting."

- 91% Agreement Among All Respondents
- "I would support informational signage about the birds (e.g., species descriptions, migrations, etc.) and wildlife that make Admirals Lake home."
- 74% Agreement Among All Respondents
- "I would like to see more free educational opportunities about our wildlife at The Shelter (e.g., bats, otters, coyotes, marine mammals, bird identification, etc.)."
- 59% Agreement Among All Respondents

Residents are not required to voice their interests and concerns regarding the lake, so for those who completed survey, we thank you for your time and cooperation. Similar surveys regarding the lake will be conducted periodically online to adjust lake management direction. If you have suggestions for Admirals Lake Committee (germane to the management of Admirals Lake), please contact the Committee Chairs, Bob Wilbur and Bill Blake.

The Lake Committee is changing leadership from Ed Delahanty and his predecessor, Mike Tenore, who for years have effectively guided numerous lake problems, from monitoring water chemistry, to related algal problems, to investigating the state of the outfall pipe. Both will remain active, however, as committee members.

Taking their place are co-chairs Bill Blake, Natural Resource Manager, and Bob Wilbur, Aquatic Biologist, both with years of related work behind them. And there are relatively new members to the committee -- Heide Island, an animal behavior/neuroscience professor at Pacific University, Pete Klasell with Washington Department of Transportation, taking after his dad, John, who designed and installed the tide gate years ago, and Bob Payton, the Otter Gate Maker.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE: BOARD NOMINATIONS NOW OPEN

Nominations for two ACBC Board of Director positions are open now and will close on November 15. Election of Directors will occur via mail in ballots issued in January of 2021. The ballots will be tallied the day before the Annual Members Meeting, the results being announced at that meeting.

REQUIREMENTS & RESPONSIBILITIES:

Directors must be members in good standing, serve for a 3 year term and can serve no more than 6 consecutive years. The Board is responsible for maintenance of Club facilities and the operation of the Club in compliance with the Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws and all applicable government regulations.
